From the Pastor's Desk:

No one can deny many of the founding fathers of the United States of America were men of deep religious convictions based in the Bible and their Christian Faith. Of the 56 men who signed the Declaration of Independence, nearly half held seminary or Bible school degrees. These Christian quotes of the founding fathers will give you an overview of their strong moral and spiritual convictions which helped form the foundations of our nation and our government.

George Washington 1st U.S. President: "While we are zealously performing the duties of good citizens and soldiers, we certainly ought not to be inattentive to the higher duties of religion. To the distinguished character of Patriot, it should be our highest glory to add the more distinguished character of Christian."

John Adams 2nd U.S. President and Signer of the Declaration of Independence: "Suppose a nation in some distant Region should take the Bible for their only law Book, and every member should regulate his conduct by the precepts there exhibited! Every member would be obliged in conscience, to temperance, frugality, and industry; to justice, kindness, and charity towards his fellow men; and to piety, love, and reverence toward Almighty God ... What a Eutopia, what a Paradise..."

Thomas Jefferson 3rd U.S. President, Drafter and Signer of the Declaration of Independence: "God who gave us life gave us liberty. And can the liberties of a nation be thought secure when we have removed their only firm basis, a conviction in the minds of the people that these liberties are of the Gift of God? That they are not to be violated but with His wrath? Indeed, I tremble for my country when I reflect that God is just; that His justice cannot sleep forever; That a revolution of the wheel of fortune, a change of situation, is among possible events; that it may become probable by Supernatural influence! The Almighty has no attribute which can take side with us in that event. I am a real Christian – that is to say, a disciple of the doctrines of Jesus Christ."

John Hancock 1st Signer of the Declaration of Independence: "Resistance to tyranny becomes the Christian and social duty of each individual. ... Continue steadfast and, with a proper sense of your dependence on God, nobly defend those rights which heaven gave, and no man ought to take from us."

Benjamin Franklin Signer of the Declaration of Independence and Unites States Constitution: "Here is my Creed. I believe in one God, the Creator of the Universe. That He governs it by His Providence. That He ought to be worshipped. That the most acceptable service we render to him is in doing good to his other children. That the soul of man is immortal, and will be treated with justice in another life respecting its conduct in this. These I take to be the fundamental points in all sound religion, and I regard them as you do in whatever sect I meet with them. As to Jesus of Nazareth, my opinion of whom you particularly desire, I think the system of morals and his religion, as he left them to us, is the best the world ever saw, or is likely to see." Registration for Religious Education for the 2025-2026 School Year

Registration forms are available in the church vestibule. The cost is \$50.00 per child and to not exceed \$100.00 per family. If you are a new registration please call the Religious Education office at 401-944-6040, so Mrs. Megan Reitz can schedule an appointment to meet with you. New registrations require a completed application form, the registration fee and a copy of your child's Baptismal Record. Classes for Grade 1-5 are on Sunday mornings from 10:45 am to 11:50 am and for Grades 6-8 are Monday evenings from 6:30 pm to 7:50 pm.

2025-2026 Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA ~ Adult Education)

This program is for any non-Catholic adult wishing to make a faith commitment to Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church, or for Catholics who have been Baptized, Confirmed and made First Communion, but then drifted from the faith. Catholics who were Baptized, but never received Confirmation and or Eucharist can participate in this program as well. This process of formation is completed with the reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion at Easter. Why September is Perfect for Young Saint Canonizations

When it was announced that Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati would be canonized saints on September 7, 2025, it felt like more than just a scheduling decision. Originally scheduled to be canonized earlier, the shift in date, coming after the death of Pope Francis, seems to carry with it a divine nudge, a holy coincidence perfectly timed for the lives of countless teens and young adults around the world. September is a month of transition. Summer slowly fades, giving way to sharpened pencils, packed lunchboxes, and new beginnings. For students, it's a time marked by anticipation, anxiety, and hope. It's a time of year when teens and young adults could use a little extra help — spiritual companions who understand the weight of exams, identity struggles, social pressure, and the need for authentic purpose. Enter Carlo and Pier Giorgio...



Summer slowly fades, giving way to sharpened pencils, packed lunchboxes, and new beginnings. For students, it's a time marked by anticipation, anxiety, and hope. It's a time of year when teens and young adults could use a little extra help — spiritual companions who understand the weight of exams, identity struggles, social pressure, and the need for authentic purpose. Enter Carlo and Pier Giorgio...

Two young men, generations apart, who lived radically ordinary lives, transformed by extraordinary love for Christ. Carlo, a teenager from modern-day Italy who harnessed the power of the internet to evangelize, and Pier Giorgio, a lover of the mountains and the poor, who radiated joy even as he walked his short path of suffering. Both were deeply in the world of youth and never went beyond this stage of life. Both knew what it meant to live amidst peers, technology, expectations and to rise above it with joy, humility, and faith. To canonize these saints just as school doors swing open is, in a way, to send them forth as spiritual prefects for a new academic year. What a gift.

The early days of the school year are not only about fresh syllabi and clean notebooks. They're also a time of personal recalibration. After summer's freedom, students are asked to rediscover focus, discipline, and vision. It's easy for faith to become peripheral in the rush of routines and deadlines. But saints like Carlo and Pier Giorgio show us that holiness isn't found apart from these things, it's found right within them. Carlo made time for daily Mass and Eucharistic adoration alongside his schoolwork and video games. Pier Giorgio juggled studies in engineering with service to the poor and contagious laughter among friends. Their canonizations this September serve as holy reminders that sanctity is not only achievable, but beautifully accessible, even (and especially) in classrooms, campus cafeterias, and dormitory corridors. September also turns our minds to the days when autumn turns to Advent. It's a season associated with harvest, gathering the fruits of labor, maturity, and growth. It's when students begin to settle into the rhythms that shape the rest of the year. Canonizing Carlo and Pier Giorgio now invites young people to think of their lives as fertile ground for grace, ready to yield a harvest of kindness, courage, and quiet heroism. It's a powerful message: you don't have to wait until you're older, wiser, or more "perfect" to become a saint. You can start today at 15, 20, or wherever you are.

Let's not forget that both of these young men are missionaries in their own way, Carlo in the digital world, Pier Giorgio in the physical one. Their lives remind today's youth that evangelization isn't limited to pulpits or mission trips. It can happen in Instagram captions, group chats, hiking trails, or subway rides. As young people step back into the rhythm of academic and social life this September, these saints arrive just in time, not as distant holy figures, but as brothers who understand the terrain and walk it beside them. In the end, it feels providential. While the death of Pope Francis reshuffled the timeline of events, one can't help but feel that September 7 was chosen from heaven long ago. Perhaps God knew that in this particular season, of new beginnings, anxious hearts, and hopeful dreams, young people would most need to be reminded of who they are and who they can become. Bl. Carlo Acutis and Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati, soon to be canonized saints, are not just gifts for the Church. They are gifts for this generation. And what better time to unwrap those gifts than in September, when the world needs to remember that youth is not a waiting room for holiness, but fertile soil for sainthood.

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
