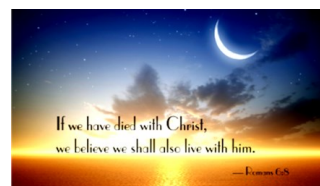
From the Pastor's Desk:

Just looking at our surroundings could easily turn our thoughts to death and dying. Leaves turn brilliant colors before dying and falling to earth. There are fewer pages in our calendars as the year slowly dies. With fewer hours of sunlight and a chill in the air each day dies more rapidly into night. The Church year is also quickly coming to an end and another begins with the approach of Advent later in November. The month begins, however, by turning our attention to what happens after death with our annual celebration of All Saints and the commemoration of All Souls.

All Saints Day celebrates all those men and women from every time and place who have lived good and holy lives, have died in a state of grace, and now enjoy the blessedness of Heaven. Scores of uncanonized saints fill the streets of Heaven - some of them people we have known and revered in our lives. The Resurrection of the Lord Jesus promises both the particular judgment of our souls immediately after death, but also awaits the Last Judgment when our bodies and souls will be reunited for eternity. The saints spur us on to lives of holiness NOW so that when we die their reward might be our own. Salvation can never be taken for granted. The Lord Jesus tells us the gate is narrow and many who seek admittance are unable to enter - but the saints demonstrate that it is possible! On this festive day we beg their prayers for us as we honor them.

The Commemoration of All Souls turns our attention to those who have died destined for Heaven but unable to be admitted immediately because they did not die free from sin. Purgatory is the state for those awaiting final purification before entering God's Kingdom. It is both our privilege and our responsibility to assist the faithful departed by our prayers for them. In every Mass there is a remembrance of the dead just after the Consecration. The Catholic Church has always distinguished herself by her suffrages for the dead. Each year All Souls Day allows us to remember our beloved dead with devotion and to pray for all those, especially the forgotten, who are in need of our assistance.

There will come a day when either All Saints or All Souls will be our own feast. We can prepare now by taking our salvation seriously and relying completely on the mercy of Jesus. Through frequent Confession we remain in a state of grace ourselves and the prayers we offer for the dead are acts of charity. These are good springboards for living a Christian life today and everyday until the Lord calls us home.

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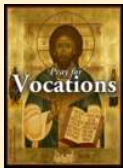

## All Saints Day & All Souls Day

*November 1st & November 2nd*

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let the perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed through the mercy of God rest in peace. Amen. It has been the Tradition of the Church that during the month of November we remember, in a special way, all the souls of the faithfully departed. In fact, an Indulgence is granted the Christian Faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in Purgatory. This indulgence is a *Plenary* one (frees a person from all temporal punishment due to sin). On the other days of the year this indulgence is a *Partial* one (frees a person from some of the temporal punishment due to sin).

God created human beings that they might possess their Creator in the Beatific Vision. But nothing defiled can enter Heaven, therefore those who are less than perfect must be *purified* before they can be admitted. The Church teaches that there exists Purgatory. Purgatory is the place in which the souls of the just who die with the stains of sins are cleansed by expiation before they are admitted to Heaven. They can be helped, however, by the prayers of the faithful on earth. The souls of the just are those that leave the body in the state of sanctifying grace and are therefore destined to enter Heavenly Glory. Their *Particular Judgment* was favorable, but they must be cleansed before they can see the face of God. The "stains of sins" means the temporal punishment due to mortal or venial sins already forgiven as to guilt but not fully remitted as to penalty when a person dies. The Church understands purgatory to mean the state or condition under which the faithful departed undergo purification.

The teaching of the Church about purgatory finds corroboration in the Bible. The text of 2 Maccabees 12:46 presupposes after-death purification. So do the words of our Lord: "*Whoever says anything against the Holy Spirit will not be forgiven, either in this age or in the age to come*" Matthew 12:32. As similar conclusion can be drawn from 1 Corinthians 3:11-15. The Catholic practice of praying for the poor souls is based on the Church's faith in the Communion of Saints. Although not defined doctrine, it is commonly held that the essential pain in purgatory is the pain of loss, because the souls are temporarily deprived of the Beatific Vision. However, there is no comparison between this suffering and the pains of Hell. It is temporary and therefore includes the assured hope of one day seeing God face to face. It is borne with patience, since the souls realize that purification is necessary out of love for God and with perfect surrender to do His Will.

Prayer for the Souls in Purgatory: Good Jesus, Your loving Heart was ever moved by the sorrows of others. Look with pity on the souls of my dear ones in purgatory. Hear my cry for mercy, and grant that those whom You called from our home and hearts may soon enjoy everlasting rest in the home of Your love in Heaven. Amen.

## **Classroom News..Mrs. Marcozzi's Marvelous 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders**

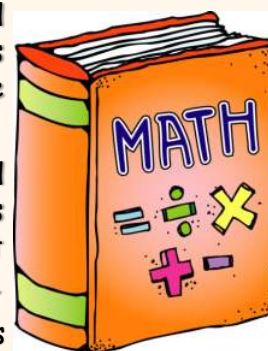
The children are continuing to work on rules and routine of the classroom. We are improving every day!

There is always something new and exciting happening at St Rocco School so we are always eager to see what is happening next!



In Reading to date, we have worked on different types of story genres such as informational text, folktales, myths, traditional tales, and realistic fiction. For a second year in a row the favorite story so far has been **Cocoliso**, a realistic fiction story. This story is about a young boy having big dreams of becoming a pilot. One day he finds a white crocodile on the side of the road and his dreams start to change, a little... Maybe it is possible to have more than one dream. The children are working hard on completing their personal narratives. They brainstormed possible topics to write about and its purpose, they composed a setting, and are in the process of developing a dialogue.

In Math, we learned to add 3 and 4 digit numbers and money, with and without regrouping, and regrouping multiple times. The third graders learned associative and commutative properties and within that how to use mental math to get to the nearest ten and the nearest hundred.



In Social Studies our focus was on our communities, where they learned that citizens are part of a community and that there are rules and laws that need to be followed in order to keep everyone safe. They learned that communities are unique and have different geographies, histories, and jobs.

In Religion we just completed our lessons on "The Circle of Grace". This is a yearly topic in our religion curriculum where your child learns about different life situations that are age-appropriate. We had great discussions on who our "trusted" adults are and ways to protect ourselves (our circle of grace) if someone asks us to do something we are uncomfortable doing! Everyone had amazing ideas and did a great job identifying appropriate and in appropriate scenarios, such as being kind vs. unkind to a classmate.



On Fridays, we have "fun Friday" at the end of the day, where the children have a seasonal arts and crafts activity as well as educational centers. We are blessed to have our "big sister" Ms. Lorraine donating items to our seasonal crafts, we are very thankful for her!

We have so many more fun things planned in the coming weeks as we enter our busy season. The children are so excited to see what is happening next!

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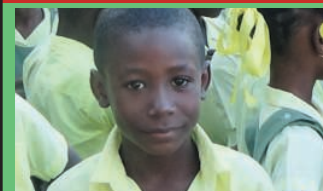
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
